



## **Shadow Visits**

Your student has been invited to participate in the final step of our admissions process and is scheduled for an upcoming shadow visit. Please review the information below before your visit.

### **Arrival and Check-In**

- Please arrive and enter through the South Entrance of the school.
- A parent must escort students into the building for check in at 8:00 am.
- Upon arrival, you will sign in your student and be asked to provide the office with emergency contact information. You will also be issued a carpool tag for the drop-off/pick-up lines.
- We do not administer medication to students who are shadowing.

### **Duration**

Our K-1st grade shadows join us for two half days (8am-11:30am) and a full day (8am-3:15pm) over three days, and our 2nd-12th grade shadows join us for three consecutive days, unless otherwise agreed upon. During the visit, an administrator may contact you if needed.

### **What to Expect**

- Shadows are assigned to follow a Trinity student in the same cohort/grade level for three days.
- Students will be encouraged to engage in classwork and participate in discussions and activities. They will be moving to and from classes with their classmates.
- Prospective students are administered academic assessments in reading and math by certified and licensed faculty. These assessments are for internal purposes only and are not diagnostic.
- Counselors and administrators will also meet prospective students to learn more about them.
- Students are encouraged to try food prepared by Chef Mackenzie while visiting. If they prefer, they may bring their lunch.

### **Dress Code**

Visiting students can wear what they are comfortable in; however, we encourage them to wear clothes similar to our school uniform, such as khakis and a navy, white, or hunter-green collared shirt. Clothing should be appropriate for a Christian school, and students should wear closed-toed shoes.

### **Dismissal**

- Parents must pick up students at 3:15 p.m. in the office at the school's south entrance or through the carpool lanes (details below) using the issued tag.



### Lower School (K-5)

Line up in front of the Trinity School building facing north. Line continues on the east side of N. Walker Ave. leading into Trinity parking lot.

### Middle School (6-7)

Line up on the west side of N. Hudson Ave. facing south. Start line before alleyway between Trinity School and the business complex. Line continues on N. Hudson Ave. north of NW 32nd St.

### Upper School (8-12)

Line up on the south side of NW 32nd St. facing east. Start line before N. Hudson Ave. After pickup continue east on NW 32nd St. or turn north on N. Hudson Ave.



### Next Steps

After your student completes their visit, teachers and administrators provide feedback on their experience to our admissions committee. The committee reviews that information, parent discussions, prospective student feedback, and testing and assessment information. The committee votes to accept or decline admission.

### Moving Forward

If a student is not accepted at Trinity, it is typically because our programs do not provide the support your student needs to excel. Our administrators and counselors strive to provide families with recommendations about programs and services that could better support their student. Prospective students may be invited to shadow more than once before they are admitted to Trinity.
